They are advocates of the importance of openness in all aspects of the creative process and support music education rooted in the fundamentals through opportunities like the *Creative Music Workshops* which attracts participants of every age, at all skill levels from all over.



Old City - New Voices





Jerry Granelli was born in San Francisco 1940 and he cut his chops in the vibrant jazz scene there from the late Fifties on. Among many sessions, he played with the Vince Guaraldi Trio on the innovative score for *A Charlie Brown Christmas* which has become a popular favourite and a jazz classic.

He moved to Halifax over three decades ago and has become a much loved figure in the music scene of the entire East Coast. He was one of the founders and has been a steadfast supporter of what started out as the Atlantic Jazz Festival and is now the largest music festival east of Montreal.

He has mentored and encouraged young musicians beyond counting and has also found time to compose and record and tour with ground breaking work of his own and in collaborations with others. He looks to Buddhist teachings to define his role as an artist in the world.

According to Jerry:

One reason why people like improvised music is that it is a direct reflection of life, not something we thought up.

It scares you.

Makes you think you are going to die for a moment
do you have the courage to play?

Can I move out of my desires and wants and into


compositional choices?


